Lectio Divina prayer sessions will be starting on Monday 6th June in the Grotto Chapel in Feeny after the 9:30am Mass, and will continue each Monday. Lectio Divina is a spiritual practice that is an effective and popular form of prayer among many Catholics today. Lectio Divina is not meant as an intellectual study of the Bible, but as a means of communion with God through reading and listening to Sacred Scripture. This form of prayer consists of four parts: listening to a passage of Scripture, reflecting on the passage, prayer, and a time of contemplation. The aim is meeting God, not just completing the steps, therefore it is a good form of prayer for people who like structure and also for those who struggle with it. Each week the sessions will be reflecting on the Gospel reading for the following Sunday, which aims to help people focus on the piece of Scripture that they will be hearing at the following weekends Masses. For on this day not only have we been confirmed in our possession of paradise, but we have even entered heaven in the person of Christ; through his grace we have regained far more than we lost through the devil's hatred.' Feasts this week:

Tuesday 31st May: The Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary This day commemorates and celebrates the visit of the expectant Blessed Virgin Mary to her cousin Elizabeth, who was herself was expecting St John the Baptist after a long period of infertility. Mary left to visit Elizabeth immediately after the Annunciation. It is believed Mary stayed for three months, until St John the Baptist's birth, offering help and support to her cousin.

Wednesday 1st June: St Justin (c. AD 100 – c. AD 165) was an early Christian apologist (defended Christianity against objections) and philosopher. He was Greek but self-identified as Samaritan and defined himself as a Gentile since he was uncircumcised. The First Apology, his most well-known text, passionately defends the morality of the Christian life, and provides various ethical and philosophical arguments to convince the Roman emperor, Antoninus, to abandon the persecution of the Church. Like St. Augustine, after him, he claimed that the "seeds of Christianity" actually predated Christ's incarnation, and that many historical Greek philosophers (like Socrates and Plato), were 'unknowing Christians'. Justin believed that the Greek philosophers had derived the most essential elements of truth found in their teaching from the Old Testament. He was beheaded after defending Christianity as the 'true philosophy'; making no 'sacrifice to the gods' and for 'disobeying the emperor'. He is venerated as a saint by the Catholic Church, Eastern Orthodox Church and in Anglicanism.

Friday 3rd June: St Kevin was a native of Leinster and grew up in Kilnamanagh where he received his early religious formation. Wishing to be hermit, he crossed the mountains to Glendalough and settled at the foot of the upper lake. Despite his wishes, disciples gathered round him. A great monastic settlement grew throughout the glen after his death in 618.
